An Overview of the Growth of the Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Program in Saskatchewan

1944 The first Apprenticeship Act designated 13 trades: Blacksmith, Bricklayer, Carpenter, Electrician, Mason, Plumber, Steamfitter, Painter and Decorator, Plasterer, Sheet Metal Worker, Motor Mechanic, Motor Vehicle Repairer, Watchmaker

1945 The Apprenticeship Branch was formed (Department of Labour) *49 contracts were registered

1946 *303 contracts were registered

1951 The Apprenticeship and Trademen's Qualification program was initiated: PAB/TABs established

1964 Red Seal program introduced in Saskatchewan

1965 *18 designated trades

1994 50th Anniversary of apprenticeship in Saskatchewan *37 designated trades; 3500 apprentices

Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission was proclaimed October 1, 1999
 *46 designated trades; 5300+ apprentices

2002 Tuition fees implemented *47 designated trades

2003 *49 designated trades

Fast Facts

(Activity from July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005)

- Journeyperson certification in a designated trade in Saskatchewan requires individuals to have a broad and in-depth range of work experience and to have successfully passed an examination.
- ➤ There are 50 designated trades. Four of the trades require compulsory apprenticeship training: *Electrician, Plumber, Refrigeration Mechanic, Sheet Metal Worker.*
- > 5436 apprentices are registered in the system.
- ➤ 2911 apprentices attended technical training during 2004-2005.
- ➤ 1035 journeyperson certificates were issued in Saskatchewan during 2004-2005.
- Employers hire and register apprentices, and provide journeyperson supervision to apprentices.
- Industry, both provincially and nationally, sets the standard for training and certification in the trades.
- An equal number of employers and employee representatives are appointed to Trade Boards. In 2004-2005, the Commission had 40 active trade boards with 221 members.
- The Commission Board is an innovative public and private sector partnership. The Board is industry-led. Government, under-represented groups and trainers are also represented on the Commission Board.
