Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship (SYA) Scholarships

Apprenticeship Facts

July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009

- 10,957 apprentices were registered and received services during the year. Of these, 2,827 were new apprentices.
- 5,011 apprentices attended technical training
- 1,235 journeyperson and proficiency certificates were issued in Saskatchewan
- The Commission Board is an innovative public and private sector partnership. The Board is industry-led. Government, under-represented groups and trainers are also represented on the Commission Board.
- An equal number of employers and employee representatives are appointed to Trade Boards. In 2008-09, the Commission had about 200 trade board members.
- Industry, both provincially and nationally, sets the standard for training and certification in the trades.
- There are 47 designated trades, four require compulsory apprenticeship training - Electrician, Plumber, Refrigeration Mechanic and Sheet Metal Worker.

History of Apprenticeship

- 1944 The first Apprenticeship Act designated 13 trades: Blacksmith, Bricklayer, Carpenter, Electrician, Mason, Plumber, Steamfitter, Painter and Decorator, Plasterer, Sheet Metal Worker, Motor Mechanic, Motor Vehicle Repairer, Watchmaker
- 1945 The Apprenticeship Branch was formed (Department of Labour); 49 contracts were registered
- 1946 303 contracts were registered
- 1951 The Apprenticeship and Trademen's Qualification program was initiated; Provincial Apprenticeship Board and Trade Advisory Boards established
- 1958 Certificate of Status was in force
- 1959 First Interprovincial Standards Red Seal Endorsement issued in Canada
- 1964 Red Seal program introduced in Saskatchewan
- 1965 18 designated trades
- 1983 Apprenticeship Branch moved to the Department of Advanced Education and Manpower (later known as Saskatchewan Education; Saskatchewan Education, Training and Employment; Post-Secondary Education and Skills Training; and Saskatchewan Learning)
- 1987 The Apprenticeable Trades Coordinating Group (ATCoG) was established by the Provincial Apprenticeship Board in response to an initiative taken by the Canada Employment and Immigration Commission. In conjunction with Saskatchewan Education, they identified updating training needs of journey persons in the designated trades and purchased training on their behalf.
- 1994 50th Anniversary of apprenticeship in Saskatchewan
37 designated trades; 3,500 apprentices
- 1999 Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission was proclaimed October 1, 1999
46 designated trades; 5,300+ apprentices
- 2001 The Commission moved to its own facility at 2140 Hamilton Street in Regina
- 2002 Tuition fees implemented. 47 designated trades
- 2004 Scaffolder as a new subtrade of the Carpenter trade was recognized. The Meat Cutter trade and Framer subtrade of the Carpenter trade were designated. 50 designated trades; 5,200+ apprentices
- 2005 Rig Technician trade designated. Barber Stylist and Cosmetologist trades combined into the Hairstylist trade.
- 2006 Province-wide implementation of the Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship (SYA) program
- 2007 2,045 students from 82 schools enrolled in the SYA Program
- 2008 8,100+ apprentices
- 2009 47 designated trades; 8,900+ apprentices; 4,000+ students enrolled in SYA from 210 schools
