

## Mobile Crane Operator Interprovincial Journeyperson Examination Information

<b>Apprentice Requirements:</b>	3 years and 5400 hours
<b>Tradesperson Requirements:</b>	4.5 years and 8100 hours
<b>Practical Examination:</b>	No

The interprovincial (IP) journeyperson examination for this trade is developed by a national committee of worker and employer representatives. The content for IP Examinations is drawn from the National Occupational Analysis (NOA) for that trade and is based on industry's standards and expectations. You can download and print a free copy of the NOA from the Red Seal website by visiting <http://www.red-seal.ca>.

To write the interprovincial journeyperson examination, you must either successfully complete an apprenticeship training program or meet tradesperson eligibility requirements. The pass mark is 70%.

## Requirements for proving your work experience:

One third of your work experience must be in hydraulic crane, one third must be in conventional crane, and the remaining third may be in either.

The Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission supplies a document called a **Form 6** to assist you in verifying your on-the-job experience. To be accepted, every Form 6 must include the following information:

- Make and model of crane;
- Classification or type of machine (hydraulic, conventional, hoist, etc.);
- Size (tonnage) of machine;
- Approximate number of hours you spent operating each make and model (seat time), and
- Approximate number of hours you spent doing maintenance or service work.

**If you submit an incomplete form, your application for examination may be delayed.**

## Mobile Crane Operator - Red Seal Examination Breakdown

An Interprovincial Red Seal examination is based on the National Occupational Analysis (NOA) for the trade. The NOA describes the skills and knowledge required to perform the duties of the trade. The standard is divided into Blocks, which are then divided into Tasks, and then more specifically into Sub-tasks.

The Red Seal examination has a certain number of questions assigned to these sections. The number of questions are provided below.
