Apprentice Requirements:	2 years and 2400 hours
Tradesperson Requirements:	3 years and 3600 hours
Practical Examination:	No

The interprovincial (IP) journeyperson examination for this trade is developed by a national committee of worker and employer representatives. The content for IP Examinations is drawn from the National Occupational Analysis (NOA) for that trade, and is based on industry's standards and expectations. You can download and print a free copy of the NOA from the Red Seal website by visiting www.red-seal.ca.

To write the interprovincial journeyperson examination, you must either successfully complete an apprenticeship training program or meet tradesperson eligibility requirements. The pass mark is 70%.

Subject	Percent
Common Occupational Skills: performs safety-related functions; uses and maintains tools and equipment; organizes work; performs routine trade activities.	23%
Site Work: prepares site; performs ground work; services site; performs basic demolition; performs safety watch.	19%
Scaffolding and Access Equipment: uses scaffolding; uses access equipment.	9%
Concrete Work: forms concrete; places and finishes concrete; modifies concrete; places/applies grout, epoxies, and caulking.	18%
Masonry Work: prepares for masonry work; tends to bricklayers.	10%
Utilities and Pipeline: installs utility piping for water and sewer installations; performs pipeline activities.	11%
Roadwork: installs road surface material; installs roadwork components.	10%
