All current public health orders at time of examination must be followed.

General Information:

- There is both a written and a practical component to the Interprovincial Journeyperson Examination.
- Both the written and the practical examination may be video recorded.
- The written examination must be completed successfully before applying for the practical examination.
- This is an information package regarding the Saskatchewan Journeyperson
 Esthetician Nail Technician Practical Examination. The examination is
 comprehensive and is designed to test the full spectrum of basic knowledge, skill
 and attitudes of the trade. The Nail Technician examination is developed by the
 Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission in co-operation with a
 committee of employee and employer representatives selected from industry. The
 content for the examination is based on the above committee's standards for a
 Saskatchewan Journeyperson.
- Examination assessors are vetted by the SATCC to ensure expertise in the trade. This
 expertise is applied in assessing the competencies required for each examination
 section. A predetermined score sheet has been developed by the Esthetician
 Curriculum and Examination Development Board (CEDB) to maintain consistent
 marking practices.
- Verbal or physical abuse by candidates towards any person at the examination facility will not be tolerated. Instances of abuse will result in the immediate termination of the candidate's examination attempt at the expense of the candidate.
- Absolutely no cell phones, communication devices or imaging devices of any sort are allowed in the examination facility. You will be required to leave immediately if any of these items are found in your possession.

Please note that examinations and study information change frequently. The most recent information, such as the Esthetician – Nail Technician Saskatchewan Occupational Standard (SOS), is available on our web site at www.saskapprenticeship.ca.



GUIDELINES FOR ESTHETICIANS REGARDING SANTITATION, DISINFECTION AND STERILIZATION (SDS) SAFE WORK PRACTICES

Safe Work Practices are required at all times:

If unsafe work practices are demonstrated during a section of the examination, the applicable section will be marked as zero (0). Any candidate's assessment may be discontinued in the event of endangerment to clients or themselves. The SATCC consultant supervising the examination will notify the candidate.

Unsafe work practices can be organized into four categories:

Unsafe Work Practices

Contraindications	 Working on a contraindication, such as filing the nail when the fingertip is infected (red and swollen). A candidate or model having a contagious condition, such as dermatophytes.
Potential Injury	The candidate demonstrates incorrect skills or lack of knowledge that will likely injure the model. For example, if the candidate has set their wax pot too hot.
Injury	The candidate demonstrates incorrect skills or lack of knowledge that injure the model. For example, if the candidate spills blood or other body fluids.
SDS	The candidate demonstrates incorrect skills or lack of knowledge that may lead to cross-contamination, including but not limited to, incorrect label identification, misuse of SDS chemicals, and insufficient SDS practices.

Not all types of unsafe work practices are listed above.

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Important Reminder:

All Esthetician – Nail Technician Examinees:

A completed Client Consultation Card must be completed with the model prior to the practical examination and given to the invigilator upon 8 am arrival at the practical examination.

Tasks on the practical examination that are connected to the client consultation card are highlighted in green in this Candidate Information Package.

Models:



You will need one model only for all services: **For privacy reasons, we request the use of a female model only**. You may not use an Esthetician/Hairstylist, Esthetician/Hairstylist student or any industry affiliated person as a model.

All models must have polish-free nails and sufficient callus.

The use of full well, opaque nail tips are required to show competency in customization and blending.

It is advisable to bring a model on whom all competencies can be performed. For example, a model may have their toenails clipped short and filed. Clipping and filing toenails is a competency, and because it cannot be performed, the candidate would receive a mark of zero (0) for the pedicure section of the examination. It is also advisable to bring a model without contraindications.

The model must be:

- over 18 years of age.
- without health conditions such as diabetes.
- without artificial nail enhancements.

The model must have polish-free nails.

Candidates and models must complete a *Release Form* and *Client Consultation Form* prior to the practical examination and give them to the invigilator upon 8 am arrival at the practical examination.

Models who have extensive knowledge of esthetics, such as apprentices, journeypersons, or other workers in the trade are not permitted. The use of a model with extensive knowledge will immediately result in an examination result of unsuccessful.



Equipment, Supplies, and Materials:

What must I bring?

- Only professional grade equipment and supplies are permitted.
- *IMPORTANT: Products must be in original containers with original, legible manufacturer's label and expiry date (trial/travel sizes are accepted).
- Sanitized/Disinfected tools, materials, linens, equipment, and supplies needed to perform and demonstrate all competencies of the Nail Technician Practical Examination.
- A proper sharps container, puncture-resistant and leak-proof that can be used for handling, storage, transport and disposal of sharps. The container must be labelled with the international biohazard symbol. This container can be obtained from and disposed of at any drug store facility.
- Bring a supply of sharps (if they will be used) in a sealable plastic container.
- A <u>completed</u> client consultation card that pertains to the services being performed. Please submit the completed client consultation card to the invigilator prior to the examination.
- All necessary tools such as overhead light, linens, equipment and supplies (including extension cord).
- A powder-liquid (low odour or odourless) system with disposable forms is required.

What is provided?

• Bare manicure tables, pedicure chairs or facial beds as per availability.

Requirements:

- Wear <u>professional</u>, industry appropriate clothing and footwear such as lab coat, smock, apron or other professional attire.
- Ensure that all tools and equipment are in good working order. For example, no rust on implements. Unsafe tools and/or equipment may be unsafe to use on models and may result in the discontinuation of the examination.
- Products used during the practical must be in original containers (products in refilled containers will not be allowed for use)
- If open-shelf life for a product is displayed, the date that the product was opened must be noted on product packaging.
- Products are required to be within their expiration date (products which are expired will not be allowed for use)
 - If your product is found to be expired:
 Replace the product immediately, or
 Continue without the product and accept the marks deducted. (A score of 0 (zero) will be awarded in every task the expired product is used.)
- All products used must be a professional grade. (i.e., purchased from a beauty wholesaler)
- All products required to complete the practical examination must be supplied by the examinee, there is no borrowing or lending out of supplies at the examination.
- Once you are assigned a workspace for the day, then set up your station.
- Always consult the invigilator (apprenticeship representative) prior to leaving the building.
- Results from this practical exam will be posted to MyATC within 4 weeks. Please do not call as they will not release personal information over the phone.



Note:

- Markers and SATCC staff have the authority to stop the practical examination to prevent injury to the models.
- Candidates are required to clean up throughout the examination and within the time limits.
- Markers will assess the sanitizing, disinfecting, and sterilizing of tools and equipment one candidate at a time.

Before the Examination

All paperwork must be completed by the candidate and model before check-in.

It is recommended for candidates to:

- Choose an all-day parking lot (You may choose to drop off your model and supplies so that you do not have too much to carry).
- Use a wheeled trolley or suitcase to carry supplies.

During the Examination

What am I expected to do?

- Bring a copy of this package and follow it during the examination.
- Practice adequate sanitation, disinfection, and sterilization practices during and between services.
- Candidates are required to clean up throughout the examination and within the time limits.
- The examination is broken into 5 sections. Each section is broken into several competencies. All competencies must be completed to receive a mark for the section.
- Each competency must be, at minimum, 70% completed to receive a mark. Minor imperfections are allowed in each competency.
- The markers will verify most competencies individually. Some competencies must be verified by both markers simultaneously, for example, form placement.
- All products must be used to the minimum of the manufacturer's specifications.

Note:

- Keep conversation at a minimum so others are not distracted.
- Although it is possible for some competencies to be completed in any order; to promote marking consistency and ease time restraints, please complete the competencies in the order provided.

- ☐ Is filing done from the right side to the centre of the free edge and the left side to the centre of the free edge?
- ☐ Is the file held at a 45° angle to the underside of the free edge and does filing takes place with an upward stroke?
- ☐ Is filing into the corners of nails avoided?
- \square Is the nail shape (free edge) proportional and consistent?
- $\hfill \square$ Is the nail buffed to a smooth surface without damage?

- ☐ Have the fingertips been soaked in a fingerbowl?
- ☐ Have the fingers and nails been brushed?
- ☐ Is the correct tool used with the correct technique to remove excess cuticle tissue from the nail?

- \square Is the debris under the free edge of nail removed?

- ☐ Is oil applied and massaged into nail plate and skin using a circular motion?
- ☐ Has a variation of the following massage movements been completed (with lotion/oils); relaxation, effleurage, joint movement, friction, kneading, deep rubbing and percussion to promote relaxation and blood circulation? (This task **must** match the client consultation card.)
- ☐ Are all traces of lotion removed from the nail plate?

- ☐ Is the polish evenly and completely covering the nail? (Red opaque polish.)
- \square Are the fingers free of smudges and/or excess polish?

 \square Is the disinfection of all manicure tools and equipment performed? (Not timed.)

- Models must have all nail polish removed.

- ☐ Are foot soak procedures completed? (i.e. foot bath preparation, soak feet, dry feet)
- ☐ Did the Esthetician verbally confirm a comfortable water temperature with the client?
- □ Does the length of the foot soak match the client consultation card?

Note: Markers may interact with models.

- ☐ Is cuticle softener applied?
- ☐ Is the correct tool used with the correct technique to remove excess cuticle tissue from the nail?
- ☐ Is the eponychium kept intact and unharmed?

Call Markers.

- ☐ Are toenails clipped so that they are even with the end of the toe? (Are the square corners intact?)
- ☐ Are toenails cleaned from debris, filed straight across, rounding them slightly at the corners to conform to the shape of the toes?
- ☐ Is a buffer used to smooth out surface scratches?

Call Markers.

☐ Are specialty tools used with the correct technique to correct client conditions such as ingrown toenails or corns? (This competency will be verbally assessed or asked to be demonstrated, if no conditions are present.)

- ☐ Is the correct tool used with the correct technique to reduce client calluses such as a credo blade or foot rasp? (One tool must be demonstrated)
- ☐ Is a disposable or stainless steel foot paddle with callus softener used to smooth rough surfaces on the ball and heel of the foot?

Note: No electric foot files are to be used.

Commonly Asked Questions

Q Is the Candidate Information Skill Checklist important?

A Yes, these are the observable and measurable parameters that markers use to assess your skills. You <u>are encouraged</u> to bring an unmarked copy of this Candidate Information Package for your review during your practical examination.

Q Who are my judges?

A We are happy to tell you that there are **no judges**, only markers. The markers are made up of highly trained Journeyperson Estheticians who are both employers and employees from throughout Saskatchewan. A panel of two (2) markers will be administering your practical to ensure a fair assessment is made of your skills to the checklist standard. The markers are to mark the <u>proficiency</u> of your skills. The results will be tabulated in Regina by Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission (SATCC) staff.

Q What if I have questions?

A You have many options. First, re-read your package of information. Second, share the checklist with your mentor/Journeyperson on staff; your mentor can offer you additional help, encouragement and support. Third, for the most up-to-date information, contact the SATCC (not your former school) for any unanswered questions. We would be happy to help you. (Regina 306-787-2444; Toll-free 1-877-363-0536)

Q Am I allowed to ask questions at the examination?

A Yes. At the beginning of the examination time will be allotted for questions. The markers and/or Field Consultant will share the answer with the entire group so that everyone can benefit from the information. The markers/Field Consultant will not answer questions relating to 'testable' material.

Q Can I ask questions during the practical examination?

- A Yes, questions may be asked during the practical examination.
 - The markers and/or Field Consultant may share the answer with the entire group;
 - They may refer you to the Candidate Information Package; or
 - They will not answer question if it relates to 'testable' material.

Q Do I really have to do a practical?

A Yes. In order for a Saskatchewan Journeyperson Certification to be awarded, a practical examination must be completed.

Q Why do I use both gel and powder liquid (odourless) systems during this examination?

A Outside of Canada, powder liquid systems are used more frequently than gel. By testing and certifying in both you enhance your mobility.

Q Some client's nails may not accept gel or powder liquid systems.

A This examination represents the opportunity to challenge a provincial certification which differs from a product-specific education system.

Q Am I allowed to use a primer under the basecoat?

A Yes. Some manufacturers use a primer with their products, and some do not. Apply your product under the manufacturers' recommendations and directions.

Q Can I use any type of Powder/Liquid system?

A As long as the product is odour-free. (UV cured powder/liquid is acceptable)

Note: For information on odourless systems, please call your esthetics distributor.

Q What is a gel, and what is a Powder/Liquid?

A Gel is a cured resin that is pre-mixed when packaged.

Powder/Liquid is custom-blended by the technician with at least two products (powder and liquid).

Q May I use an electric file?

- A Yes, you may use a professional electric nail file only.
 - o However, **no** electric foot files to be used during the pedicure, and
 - no rotary sanding tools please.

Q What type of foot bath/tub is acceptable?

- **A** Due to disinfection guidelines, only metal, glass or disposable liner refills are acceptable. **No** electric foot baths or plastic bowls may be used.
- **Q** Which files are considered disinfect able between clients? (Or which files are not single-use?)
 - A Glass or metal files are the only disinfect able implements in this category.

Q What if I want to use more than one (1) model?

A There is no provision for extra models. There are no exceptions.

Q Can the marker's decision be based on my personal style versus that of the marker?

A No. Markers are bound by strict rules which indicate a specific standard that are required for you to meet. The markers are confident that you will present yourself in a modern professional way, just as your employer and clients would expect.

Q The competencies are not in the same order as I perform them at work. Can I perform them in the order that I am used to?

A We understand that some competencies can be completed in any order. However, due to marking consistency and time restraints, please attempt to complete competencies in the order provided.

- O What if I don't finish a section?
 - A Any section that is unfinished is assigned a mark of zero (0).
- Q If I don't finish a section, does that mean I automatically fail the entire exam?
 - A Not necessarily. Each section of the exam is marked independently and then totalled out of 100%.
- Q Can I, or my model, bring food and drink into the examination room?
 - **A** Drinks, yes.
 - o Food, no. (Exceptions may apply.)
- Q With whom will the markers speak before and during the examination?
 - **A** The markers will speak with everyone during the examination.
 - o The markers may ask candidates questions for clarification of any point.
 - The markers may ask models questions.
 - The markers will confer with the field consultants during the examination.
 - The markers will confer with each other during the examination when necessary.
