

DOMESTIC GASFITTER Licensing Examination Information

Domestic Gasfitter is not a designated trade in Saskatchewan. The Domestic Gasfitter License examination is administered as a partnership with the Ministry of Government Relations. Gasfitter licensing has been transitioned over to the Technical Safety Authority of Saskatchewan (TSASK) www.tsask.ca

Domestic Gasfitters are Plumbers, Steamfitter-Pipefitters or Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Mechanics who have pursued licensing as a Domestic Gasfitter by challenging the Domestic Gasfitter License examination administered by SATCC and obtaining their license from the Technical Safety Authority of Saskatchewan (TSASK).

If you have received a Domestic Gas Certification (or equivalence) outside of Saskatchewan, contact the Technical Safety Authority of Saskatchewan (TSASK) at 1-866-530-8599.

Refer to the appropriate table on the subsequent pages for prerequisites and requirements to challenge the examination. Approved domestic gasfitter courses are listed after all the tables.

Training is a prerequisite to be eligible to challenge the Domestic Gasfitter License examination.

Candidates who require domestic gasfitter training before being eligible to challenge the Domestic Gasfitter License examination must register for the training directly with the training provider. Any fees related to the training are the candidate's responsibility.

Candidates must apply to the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission (SATCC) to write their Domestic Gasfitter License examination. Candidates should apply for the examination before registering for gasfitting training. SATCC Trade Time Assessment will issue a letter stating eligibility, or requirements, before a candidate is scheduled to write the Domestic Gasfitter License examination. The gasfitter examination will not be scheduled until the SATCC has received all the required documentation to prove eligibility.

For candidates who require Gasfitter training: **The SATCC requires a Gasfitter examination application, along with an appropriate course transcript before the certification examination will be scheduled.** Unless otherwise requested, the applicant will be booked at the next possible examination date near their provided address.

- 70% average in the training is required.
- Based on location and seat availability, most examination challenges occur within 30 days of receiving the transcript.
- Applicants must challenge the examination within one year of application or they may forfeit the application fee

NOTE – Effective July 1, 2015 Plumber and Steamfitter-Pipefitter apprentices will no longer be writing the Domestic Gasfitter License examination on the last day of Level Four training. These apprentices must apply for the examination upon receiving their Level Four transcript showing successful completion of Level Four training. A copy of the transcript must accompany the examination application.

Approved Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Mechanic Domestic Gasfitter training courses:

- Saskatchewan Piping Industry Joint Training Board - Pipe Trades Gas Program. An overall mark of 70% required. (For more information on this course or to register, email skppin@sasktel.net)
- Saskatchewan Polytechnic – Gas Fitter Domestic Gas – Refrigeration Mechanic (PIPE1803). An overall mark of 70% required. (For more information on this course or to register, call 1-866-467-4278 or visit the website at <http://saskpolytech.ca>)

Candidates who require domestic gasfitter training before being eligible to challenge the Domestic Gasfitter License examination must register for the training directly with the training provider. Any fees related to the training are the candidate's responsibility.

Examination Information:

The **Domestic Gasfitter Licensing** examinations are developed by the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission in co-operation with a committee of worker and employer representatives selected from industry. The pass mark for all examinations is 70%. Examination content is based on the expectations and standards for Saskatchewan tradespeople as follows:

Rough-in Procedures	18%
Venting	13%

Installation of Equipment	12%
Propane	9%
Testing and Servicing	12%

Note: Effective **March 1, 2021** The 2020 CSA Natural Gas and Propane Installation Code and the 2020 CSA Propane Storage and Handling Code will be provided when you write the examination.
