## **Provincial Journeyperson Examination Information**

Apprentice Requirements:	2 years and 3600 hours
Tradesperson Requirements:	3 years and 5400 hours
Practical Examination:	Yes

The provincial journeyperson examination for this trade is developed by Esthetician Journeypersons and employer representatives. The content for this examination is drawn from the Provincial Occupational Analysis (POA) and is based on industry's standards and expectations. You can download and print a free copy of the POA from the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship website by visiting <a href="https://www.saskapprenticeship.ca">www.saskapprenticeship.ca</a>.

To write the provincial journeyperson examination, you must either successfully complete an apprenticeship training program or meet tradesperson eligibility requirements. The pass mark is 70%.

There is a written examination and a practical examination. You must pass the written examination before you may apply for the practical.

Technical training can be obtained through two learning formats:

- A full Esthetician program that covers "full scope" of the trade. This training and the required "on-the-tools" trade time will prepare the apprentice to attempt the journeyperson written and practical certification examinations.
- Individual/modular courses can be delivered in almost any order. After completion of
  modular programming classes that cover the trade's minimum requirements listed below
  and the required "on-the-tools" trade time will prepare the apprentice to attempt the
  journeyperson written and practical certification examinations.

Use of cell phones, electronic imaging/recording or communication equipment is **not** permitted. You will be required to leave immediately if any of these items are found on your person.

## Esthetician-Nail Technician – Provincial Journeyperson Examination Breakdown

A provincial Journeyperson examination is based on the Saskatchewan Occupational Standard (SOS) for the trade. The SOS describes the skills and knowledge required to perform the duties of the trade. Each SOS is divided into Major Work Activity, which are divided into Tasks, which are divided into Sub-Tasks.

The provincial Journeyperson examination has a certain number of questions assigned to the sections. The number of questions are provided below. For more information, see the full Provincial Occupational Analysis for this <u>trade</u>.
