Framer – Proficiency Examination

A Proficiency examination is based on the Provincial Occupational Analysis (POA) for the trade. The POA describes the skills and knowledge required to perform the duties of the trade. Each standard is divided into Blocks, which are divided into Tasks, which are divided into Sub-tasks.
