Practical examinations:

- Journeyperson examinations in the following trades consist of written and practical examinations: Auto Body and Collision Technician, Electronics Assembler, Esthetician Nail Care Technician, Esthetician Skin Care Technician, Hairstylist, Machinist, Semiautomatic Welding Production Operator and Welder Trades.
- Candidates require a pass mark of 70% in the written examination before being eligible to apply for the practical examination.

WRITTEN EXAMINATION PROTOCOLS

Exam takers are not required to wear masks during SATCC exam sittings. They may continue wearing one if they choose based on their own personal risk assessment. If they choose to wear one, they will be required to supply their own mask.

It is SATCC's priority to retain the integrity and security of all trade examinations. SATCC examinations are "closed-book" examinations. No books or notes may be brought to the examination.

Personal belongings:

- Purses and backpacks will not be accessible during the examination.
- Food is not allowed.
- Only water in a store bought, single use clear/transparent bottle without a label is permitted.

Personal apparel:

All electronic devices are prohibited from the examination area included but not limited to:
