Celebrating Skilled Trades Success: Keenan Bresch and Wesley Rowe at Skills Saskatchewan

Each year, the Skills Canada Saskatchewan Provincial competition brings together the province's top trades and technology students to showcase their abilities—and for two competitors, the event marked both a personal milestone and a professional leap forward.

Keenan Bresch, gold medalist in Industrial Control, says his path was driven by a love of hands-on work and problem-solving. "Electrical work, especially industrial controls, stood out because it combines both," he shared. Apprenticing as a Instrumentation and Control Technician, combined with technical training at Sask Polytech gave Keenan a strong mix of theory and real-world experience.

During the competition, Bresch faced a wiring issue under intense time pressure but his preparation paid off. "I stayed calm, troubleshot step-by-step, and fixed it without panicking."

control systems, and eventually stepping into leadership roles.

Wesley Rowe, gold medalist in plumbing, followed in his father's footsteps into the trade. What started as a family connection quickly grew into a passion of his own.

Rowe gained most of his skills on the job, as an apprentice plumber but his technical training at Sask Polytech strengthened his knowledge like learning to calculate offsets and 45-degree angles, a big focus in competition. "The hardest part was figuring out all the angles, but once you slow down and draw it out, it comes together," he said.

Now focused on becoming a journeyperson plumber, Rowe sees the competition as more than a test, it's a chance to grow and collaborate. "Winning or losing doesn't mean you're better or worse. Everyone has their strengths. It's about connecting and learning from others in the trade."

Apprentices are responsible for registering for any technical training they are eligible for. Technical training is filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Once classes are opened for registration in MyATC, they remain open until they are either filled or cancelled due to lack of demand.

It is the responsibility of apprentices and employers/Joint Training
Committees to work together to determine mutually agreeable training
times. When apprentices register for technical training, employers/Joint
Training Committees receive a notification via MyATC and can view the training
apprentices have registered for.

Canadian Council of Directors of Apprenticeship (CCDA) Meeting Held in Regina

The spring CCDA meeting will be held on May 28-29, 2025 in Regina.

The CCDA provides strategic oversight of the Red Seal Program, while provincial and territorial Apprenticeship Authorities are responsible for delivering apprenticeship training and administering interprovincial Red Seal examinations.

The council serves as a platform for collaboration across jurisdictions, supporting the advancement of a certified, highly skilled, and mobile skilled trades workforce in Canada. Members also exchange and review evidence-based research to inform policy and program decisions.

As a voluntary Federal-Provincial-Territorial (FPT) partnership, the CCDA holds no regulatory authority. Each member is accountable to their respective jurisdiction. The council is composed of 15 members—one from each province and territory, along with two representatives from the federal government (Employment and Social Development Canada, ESDC). The Chair position rotates every two years.

All decisions are made through a consensus-based approach.
