Licensing Examination Information

General Gasfitter is not a designated trade in Saskatchewan. The General Gasfitter Licensing examination is administered as a partnership with the Technical Safety Authority of Saskatchewan (TSASK) www.tsask.ca

General Gasfitters are journeyperson Plumbers, Steamfitter/Pipefitters or Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Mechanics who have pursued licensing as a General Gasfitter by taking the General Gasfitter Licensing examination administered by SATCC and obtaining their license from the Technical Safety Authority of Saskatchewan (TSASK).

As of January 2017, Completion of post-journeyperson training (training completed separate of apprenticeship training) is required for all candidates seeking to take the General Gasfitter Licensing exam. Approved General Gasfitter courses are listed after the tables.

If you have received a General Gas Certification (or equivalence) outside of Saskatchewan, contact the Technical Safety Authority of Saskatchewan (TSASK) at 1-866-530-8599.

To enroll in General Gasfitter technical training, candidates must first verify their eligibility to take the General Gas Licensing exam. This process begins in MyATC, by generating the SATCC General Gas Eligibility letter.

To request a General Gas eligibility letter, candidates must log into MyATC, navigate to '**Generic Request**' > '**Other**', and enter the request: '**General Gas Letter required**'. Candidates should follow the instructions to provide any additional required documentation, such as their Journeyperson Certificate and verification of trade time (6A). The SATCC Trade Time Assessment department will then issue a letter confirming eligibility or any additional requirements.

Eligible candidates must register for technical training directly with the training provider, including submitting a copy of their SATCC General Gas Eligibility Letter with their application. Any fees related to the training are the candidate's responsibility.

To schedule the General Gasfitter Licensing exam, the SATCC requires a completed Gasfitter examination application and official General Gas course transcripts confirming a minimum mark of 70%. This information must be submitted through MyATC. Once these materials are received, unless otherwise requested, applicants are booked at the next possible examination date near their provided address.

Examination Challenge Timing and Deadlines:

- Based on location and seat availability, most examination challenges occur within 30 days of receiving the transcript.
- Applicants must challenge the examination within one year of application or they forfeit the application fee.

Candidates who require training to be eligible to challenge the General Gasfitter Licensing examination **must** register for the technical training directly with the training provider, including a copy of their SATCC *General Gas Eligibility Letter* with their application.

Any fees related to the training are the candidate’s responsibility.

Examination Information:

The **General Gasfitter Licensing** examinations are developed by the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission in co-operation with a committee of workers and employer representatives selected from industry. The pass mark for all examinations is 70%. The examination content is based on the expectations and standards for Saskatchewan tradespeople as follows:

Piping, Tools, Material	8%	10
Rough-In Procedures	19%	23
Testing, Servicing and Combustion Efficiency	16%	19
Venting	17%	20
Installation of Equipment	17%	20
Controls	13%	16
Trade Math and Science	10%	12
Total	100%	120
