Apprentice Requirements:	4 years and 6000 hours
Tradesperson Requirements:	6 years and 9000 hours
Practical Examination:	No

The Scaffolder trade examinations are developed by the Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission in co-operation with a committee of worker and employer representatives selected from industry. Examination content is based on industry's standards and expectations.

To write the proficiency examination, you must either successfully complete an apprenticeship training program or meet tradesperson eligibility requirements. The pass mark is 70%.

Scaffolder – Proficiency Examination Breakdown

A Proficiency examination is based on the Saskatchewan Occupational Standard (SOS) for the trade. The SOS describes the skills and knowledge required to perform the duties of the trade. Each standard is divided into Major Work Activities which are divided into Tasks, which are further divided into Sub- tasks.

The Proficiency Examination has a certain number of questions assigned to these sections. The number of questions are provided below. For more information, see the full Saskatchewan Occupational Standard for this [trade](#).
