Practical examinations:

- Journeyman examinations in the following trades consist of written **and** practical examinations: **Auto Body and Collision Technician, Electronics Assembler, Esthetician – Nail Care Technician, Esthetician – Skin Care Technician, Hairstylist, Machinist, Semiautomatic Welding Production Operator and Welder Trades.**
- Candidates require a pass mark of 70% in the written examination before being eligible to apply for the practical examination.

WRITTEN EXAMINATION PROTOCOLS

Once you arrive at the Exam Centre on the day of your exam, you will be asked to come in and go to the sign-in table. Have your government issued photo ID ready for confirmation of registration. The Photo ID must match what is on file in MyATC and on the Registration Sheet the day of the exam.

It is SATCC's priority to retain the integrity and security of all trade examinations. SATCC examinations are "closed-book" examinations. No books or notes may be brought to the examination.

Personal belongings:

- Calculators, erasers, pencils and work sheets are supplied.
- Purses and backpacks will not be accessible during the examination.
- Food is not allowed.
- Only water in a store bought, single use clear/transparent bottle without a label is permitted.

Personal apparel:

The following are not allowed during the examination:

- The Exam Centre maintains a "fragrance free" space.
- Sunglasses
- "Hoodies" and hooded sweaters or sweaters with pockets in the front at the midsection
- Hats, toques, ball caps*
- Coats**
- Watches***

WRITTEN EXAMINATION PROTOCOLS - continued

Electronics:

All electronic devices are prohibited from the examination area included but not limited to:

- Cell phones
- Headphones
- Wearable technology (smart glasses, smart rings, any audio, video recording devices, smart watches, fitness trackers, etc.)

SATCC employees may request client to display any items for inspection. Refusal will result in an immediate suspension of examination and review by the SATCC.

The SATCC considers Academic Misconduct, including but not limited to cheating, to be a serious infraction of the integrity of the apprenticeship and certification of students.
